

History of college

The first agricultural school in Georgia was established since 1883 by Ilia Tsinamdzgvrishvili - Georgian famous public figure and philanthropist in her own homestead land.

The curriculum was drawn up by Niko Tskhvedadze – Georgian educator. Iakob Gogebashvili , Georgian public figure and great educator , compiled Plural regulations of school.

They Taught in the school : farming, gardening, viticulture, winemaking, Horticulture, , cattle breeding, poultry breeding, beekeeping and Forestry.

Ilia Tsinamdzgvrishvili was well aware of the theory and practice of learning Value. He handed over 55 hectares of land to his school. The school had also a dormitory.

In 1924, the school was added to a special class and has been named as “An Agricultural School”,

Since 1928 renamed as “ The central trial Agricultural Institution of the Tsinamdzgvariantkari district”

Since 2008 made LEPL Tsinamdzgvrishvili's Professional Teaching Center by Reorganization of the Mtskheta Professional Lyceum and the Humanitarian-Ecological College.

In 2010 The college was liquidated.

On June 17, 2014 by the order of the Minister of Education and Science of Georgia was established
